City of Buffalo "STAND up buffalo initiative"owner & renter housing rehab program

- ► Funding assistance of up to \$20,000 is available per eligible unit.
- Eligible residents are directed to call 311 to access the City's newly launched owner-occupied & rental rehab program.
- Callers will be connected to a community-based organization intake process.
- Funds for code-related repairs and lead-based paint hazard reduction
- ► Funds repairs of a verified emergency condition such as an inoperable furnace, faulty electrical service, broken hot water tank, or break in the main water or sewer line.

City of buffalo lead grant program

- The City's new Lead Hazard Reduction Grant
- Provides up to\$12,000 per unit to property owners
- Areas that qualify: the Upper West Side and Schiller Park neighborhoods.
- Upper West Side residents are directed to call Heart of the City Neighborhoods
- Schiller Park residents are directed to call the Matt Urban Center
- to determine eligibility

NeighborWorks - Erie County homeowner revolving loan fund program

- Loans of up to \$25,000 are available at a 3.5% interest rate.
- In partnership with Home HeadQuarters, the Erie County Revolving Loan Fund Program is offered to Erie County Homeowners to make health & safety repairs to their homes.
- Administered by HOME HEADQUARTERS of Syracuse & Central NY

- Funded by The County of Erie through The Erie County Dept. of Social Services

HOME- mobility assistance program (map)

- Landlords who rent to MAP clients
- Are eligible to receive up to \$5,000 for improvements they have made to their rental property.
- The Mobility Assistance Program (MAP) assists participants in the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program
- with a move to designated opportunity areas of their choice in Erie and Niagara Counties.

BUFFALO URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY PROGRAMS

- ► 50/50 REHAB PROGRAM
- City of Buffalo's 50/50 Rehab Program offers income-eligible
- homeowners up to \$25,000 grants to fund 50% of their project cost in order to make needed home repairs. The program assists homeowners in the
- West Side, Upper West Side, Lower West Side,
- Elmwood-Bidwell, Elmwood-Bryant, Allentown, and
- Central Planning Neighborhoods with applications.

Owner-occupied home repair program

- Funding from the City of Buffalo, NYS Housing and Community Renewal, and Affordable Housing Corporation is providing low-income homeowners with dollars to help with home repairs and make them more energyefficient.
- NeighborWorks 60/40 combo home repair program
- A 60/40 Grant & Loan Home Repair Program is available for eligible homeowners in the city for health & safety repairs. Lending staff will work closely with applicants to assess eligibility.

Down payment/closing cost assistance program

- ► Funding up to \$5,000 is available to first-time homebuyers to assist in meeting closing costs and down payment expenses attributable to the purchase of a single-family home.
- Loan funds are provided at no interest as a conditional grant.
- No monthly or annual payments are required,
- However the amount provided must be repaid if the property is sold within the five-year regulatory period.
